Catchment Plan - The Wandle Trust's work on the Carshalton arm of the Wandle won the Urban Category for the 2016 UK River Prize. The rehabilitated Wandle (Carshalton) waterbody was once overwide, polluted, disconnected and impounded. The restoration carried out is an excellent example of what is possible in an urban environment. The Wandle trust have made a <u>video</u> which is a lovely insight into all those organisations and volunteers involved.

Wandle Piscators: The Piscators are running guided walks for all ages along the Wandle, showing the best places to fish and explaining what you might catch (See dates for the diary).
