Project News:

The Living Wandle Partnership is happy to announce the addition of 8 NEW COMMUNITY projects to the programme!

Mitcham Community Orchard and Gardens Pond Project:

MCOG has transformed a derelict site into a community resource. With Living Wandle funding the project will install a durable interpretation board with information about the wildlife visitors might see in the pond. It will also enable the purchase of a projecting stereo microscope to capture videos and stills of wildlife in the ponds, for use by local schools and residents.

Replacing the viewing platform on the lake at Ravensbury Park:

The current viewing platform has degraded beyond repair, the funding will enable the installation of a new platform and path to provide safe access to the lake for viewing wildlife and admiring the tranquil lake.

Fish Habitat Improvements near Phipps Bridge Road:

The aim of this <u>Environment Agency</u> led project is to increase habitat variability and provide a planted refuge area on this straight section of the river next to Deen City farm. The project will make the channel more natural and improve its value to biodiversity, especially fish.

Learning at Morden Hall Park Wetlands:

The learning team at Morden Hall Park will be able to provide equipment for river dipping, moth monitoring, bat detecting and bird watching to schools and local communities. This will make the most of the new wetland boardwalk in the park, which will improve access in the wetlands area

Living River performance Art:

In 2017 an original outdoor promenade performance along the River Wandle, led by local teenagers will animate the story of the Wandle through song, story telling and poetry. The Project will be coordinated by <u>Battersea Arts Centre</u>.

Wandle Vistas and skylines:

Still under development, this project will involve volunteers researching and documenting viewpoints and skylines of the Wandle basin.

River Wandle Wetlands Tools:

A small boat and motor will be purchased to help aid the management of the River Wandle and Wetlands by the National trust and other conservation groups, including the management of invasive species.

Wandle Celebration:

This money has enabled the Wandle Valley Forum to provide 9 Wandle community groups

with funding to aid the delivery of events and activities in Wandle Fortnight between the 10th - 25th September

this year.

Climate Change: The Living Wandle Climate Change project will commence in October 2016! London Wildlife Trust will be engaging with communities near the Wandle to make practical changes to build resilience to Climate Change, and reduce the impact it is having on the river. The project will focus on the impacts of flooding and drought.
