Volunteer Training Plan – April 2018 – Final Version



Introduction

The first volunteer Training Plan was completed in February 2013 by consultants Barker Langham for the Living Wandle Landscape Partnership (LWLP). It provided an overview of LWLP's volunteer and training activity, including audience demographics and laid out some guiding principles on managing volunteers within the partnership.

The purpose of the budget was to up-skill organisations and volunteers in the Wandle Valley who contributed time to LWLP projects. It was intended to improve the quality of the programme, whilst at the same time helping to leave a legacy and maintenance options for the projects and wider partnership activities. It also supported other groups, wherever possible, who help conserve Wandle heritage through volunteer-led activities.

Below is an overview of all training completed throughout LWLP (2013 – 2018) which details participant numbers, costs and skills gained for:

- Training paid for through the Training Plan project budget
- Training delivered in-house by LWLP staff / partner organisations
- Additional training / skills developed via ongoing mentoring and cascade training through LWLP projects

Overview of updates to the Training Plan

- June 2015 Training Plan was reviewed and simplified from the 2013 version to better suit requirements of partners.
- January 2016 Predicted underspend (of the Plan) identified and partners reviewed their training requirements. Partner consultation led to clarification around training requirements and commitment of the full £104,000 budget to training activities.
- March 2017 Overspend in other areas of LWLP led to a further review of the Plan. Surplus budget from the Plan was identified and released to help compensate overspend in other projects. A total of £29,200 had been spent to that point (Sept 2013 March 2017), with a further £57,200 due to be spent by December 2017. Approx. £18,500 was released from the Plan to other programmes in March 2017.
- January 2018 The Plan was reviewed again, in line with the final months of LWLP delivery, to identify total spend to date (Sept 2013 Jan 2018) recorded at £56,210 with £20,220 ear-marked for spending by the end of March 2018. LWLP was extended by 2 months from March to May 2018 and delivery of activities in the Training Plan was also extended to this date.
- May 2018 Total spend of the Training Plan at the end of LWLP was approximately £74,950 reduced from an original budget of £104,000
