Our aim is to enhance, protect and celebrate the industrial and natural heritage of the Wandle.

The Living Wandle Landscape Partnership supports the wider initiative to create a new regional park in the Wandle Valley, stretching from Croydon and Sutton through Merton and Wandsworth to the Thames in the North. The vision is for the Wandle Valley to be a coherent and vital part of London's green space network, creating a place rich in heritage, where people are proud to live, work and play, that contributes to the economic vibrancy of South London. This will be done by focussing on six key aims: landscape, heritage & culture, health & well-being, natural systems & resilience, people & communication and economic growth.
