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Projects Legacy Planning

There were 28 different projects delivered as part of the Living Wandle Landscape Partnership Scheme (2013 – 2018).

The staff/individuals involved in the delivery of these have considered the legacy of their own individual projects and produced legacy plans for each of them. These identify the outcomes created through their work, the actions that will be taken to help create a lasting impact, and any resources that might not already be secured. These plans can be used to identify and inform future work, we hope that Wandle Valley Partners will further progress and build on the project work that has already taken place.

Information from these plans has informed the creation of the *Landscape Scale Legacy Planning - Activities, Projects and Resources needed* document which brings all information gathered through the legacy planning process together, aligning ideas with the Landscape Scale Legacy Outcomes.
