The centre of Merton – Colliers Wood i.e. in the area around Sainsbury's & M & S, is extraordinarily rich in heritage. Some panels were installed by Groundwork some 15 or more years ago (Merton High Street, Pickle Ditch Merton Abbey Mill, Wheelhouse, Deen City Farm) but these have deteriorated and virtually illegible.

Councillor Draper has long been enthusiastic to create a "Corridor of Culture" through the area, and it has been suggested that there be a connection of Merton Priory with Colliers Wood Station (see rough sketch map from JH MPT which shows in pink a clear route). There is a good case for half a dozen new wall panels at various points along the Pickle and the Wandle as well as a sign posted trail taking in the important sites - Suggested locations:


- Precinct Wall
- Chapter House
- William Morris Works
- Nelson and "Paradise Merton"
- Pickle Ditch
- Liberty Works
- Wheelhouse?

Some of these would replace existing signage.

The idea would be completed by a panel at Colliers Wood station clearly signposting the pedestrian route around the area. The trail and signage could be installed in conjunction with the National Trust's development of a pocket park in this area.
