I'm a professional wildlife cameraman specialising in River Wildlife both below and above water for years I've wanted to film londons hidden waterways but because of not living in the capital and not having the time or funds have been unable to do so. I've created short films on conservation, public engagement and awareness for species for many groups including the Norfolk rivers trusts, Lincolnshire rivers trust and Derbyshire wildlife trust. The Love the lea group from thames 21 are keen to use me for a film so potential partnerships to be had there as well as links I have with London wildlife trust for something wider then the wandle which could be possible. In my eyes I'd like to create a film showing off the wildlife that lives in londons rivers particularly the underwater species and show that London has a rich array of wildlife present and not just its history of a polluted Thames. This would be a great tool to show the public what's living in the wandle which they wouldn't normally get to see.

This film would be focussed on the Wandle, but there could be opportunities through Jack's future projects to use the footage in films about London Rivers in general, thus raising the profile of the Wandle and it's life to a wider audience. Jack estimates the filming itself will take about a month.

As far as we can see, the number of films about the Wandle are fairly limited. There are films about the old mills and people's adventures along it, but no films about Wandle Wildlife.

This film could also support the <u>Wandle Watchers</u> project, showing people the wildlife they are likely to spot on the Wandle and encouraging them to report their sightings to GiGL.

The film could be used as an introduction to the river and help support the work of existing Wandle Groups and Projects such as:

- The children engaged with the Wandle Trust's Education project
- Wandle Trust <u>volunteers</u>
- The young people learning to fish with the Wandle Piscators angling club
- Local people engaged through the London Wildlife Trust's Wandle estates project
