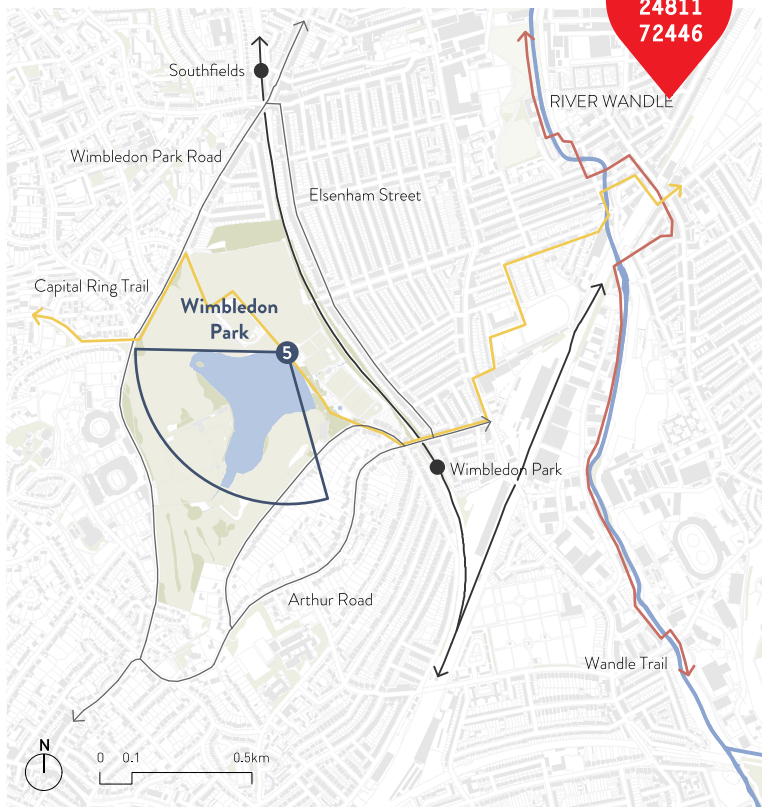


WIMBLEDON PARK

DESIGNED VIEWS AND CAPABILITY BROWN



This is a rare surviving example of a ‘designed view’ in the Wandle Valley. It was designed by Capability Brown as part of his plans for Wimbledon Park (1765-1783). It utilises the elements of water, woodland, landform and church spire (a focal point) to create a very pleasing composition.

Today the park is a hub for sport and recreation and an oasis for wildlife, featuring veteran trees, remnant historic woodland, bats, amphibians, waterfowl and many other birds. It is on sections 5 & 6 of the Capital Ring Recreational Path.
